

Grande Prairie Regional Service Centre

- The construction of a new 174,000 square foot facility on a 16.06 acre site represents a renewed commitment to Grande Prairie and northwestern Alberta.
- As a regional service centre, ATCO Electric's Grande Prairie facility oversees electrical distribution services to 73,000 residential, business and industrial customers in the City of Grande Prairie as well as Beaverlodge, Fairview, Falher, Grande Cache, High Level, Jasper, La Crete, Manning, Peace River, Rainbow Lake and Spirit River. This also includes services to rural electrification associations and Aboriginal communities in the Grande Prairie and Peace Region.
- Enhanced features of the new service centre include: metering shop; customer waiting area; large warehouse yard; cold storage facility; mechanic, wash and storage bays; training facilities and locker rooms.
- The new facility will allow ATCO Electric to increase operational efficiency by consolidating approximately 220 employees currently working out of three separate locations into one.
- The facility incorporates both office and warehouse components into one building. It is zoned so that the office spaces reside in the northwest side of the building, with warehouse space in the southwest.
