We help Aboriginal students pursue careers by funding bursary and scholarship programs at educational institutions throughout Alberta.

GRANDE PRAIRIE REGIONAL COLLEGE **ATCO ELECTRIC ABORIGINAL BURSARY**

One \$1,000 award is presented to a student of Aboriginal ancestry, enrolled in one of Grande Prairie Regional College's Forestry, Engineering, Business Administration or Commerce programs.

The student must have demonstrated financial need, and be enrolled in the next academic year. Candidates' extra-curricular activities are also considered. Summer employment may be available for the recipient depending on availability of positions (based on ATCO Electric's hiring process).

Application deadline is in December of each year.

Who should apply?

- Students of Aboriginal ancestry enrolled in Grande Prairie Regional College's Forestry, Engineering, Business Administration or Commerce Program
- Applicants with a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 1.7 in the fall semester

KEYANO COLLEGE **ATCO ELECTRIC & ATCO POWER APPRENTICE ELECTRICIAN SCHOLARSHIP**

One \$1,000 award is presented to the top student from all first-year Apprentice Electrician students of current academic year.

Application deadline is the third Friday in September each year.

Who should apply?

- Students enrolled in Keyano College's Apprentice Electrician Program
- Students of Aboriginal ancestry are encouraged to apply, although all applications will be considered

ATCO Electric and ATCO Power Electrical Technology Bursary

One \$1,000 award is presented to a first-year student enrolled in Keyano College's Electrical Technology Program.

Application deadline is the third Friday in September each year.

Who should apply?

- First year students enrolled in Keyano College's Electrical Technology program
- Students of Aboriginal ancestry are encouraged to apply, although all applications will be considered

ATCO ELECTRIC & ATCO POWER ELECTRIC CO-OP POWER ENGINEERING BURSARY

One \$1,000 award is presented annually to a student enrolled in Keyano College's Power Engineering Co-op Program. Applicants must have a minimum 1.7 GPA and demonstrated financial need.

Application deadline is the third Friday in September each year.

Who should apply?

- Students enrolled in Keyano College's Power Engineering Co-op Program
- Students of Aboriginal ancestry are encouraged to apply, although all applications will be considered

NAIT

ATCO ELECTRIC ABORIGINAL AWARD

One \$1,250 award is presented annually to a first or second-year student of Aboriginal ancestry, enrolled in NAIT's Electrical Engineering, Civil Engineering, or Telecommunications Engineering Technology program. In addition to academic requirements, this award also considers candidates' attitude and financial need.

First year applicants require satisfactory academic status in the first semester. Second-year applicants require satisfactory academic status in the third semester.

Summer employment may be available for the recipient depending on availability of positions (based on ATCO Electric's hiring process).

Application deadline is December 14, 2010.

Who should apply?

- Students of Aboriginal ancestry in their first or second year of NAIT's Electrical Engineering, Civil Engineering, or Telecommunications Engineering Technology program

ATCO Electric Aboriginal Pre-Technology Award of Excellence

One \$1,250 award is presented annually to a student of Aboriginal ancestry who has successfully completed NAIT's Aboriginal Pre-Technology program.

ATCO Electric may consider the recipient for summer employment (based on ATCO Electric's hiring process). In addition to academic requirements, this award also considers candidates' attitude and financial need.

Application deadline is December 14, 2010.

Who should apply?

- Students of Aboriginal ancestry who have successfully completed NAIT's Aboriginal Pre-Technology program
- Satisfactory academic status in Aboriginal Pre-Technology program and be entering into one of NAIT's two-year programs
